

Historical Tour to Ladakh (Batch-2021)

The Department of History is recognized for its student-focused approach to education, with a strong emphasis on integrating co-curricular activities with traditional coursework. In this direction the department organized yearly historical tour to different parts of the country. The main objective of undertaking such tours is to introduce our young generation with the rich heritage of our country. It was in this direction that the students of Batch-2021 were taken to different historical places of Leh and Kargil between 23-09-2023-29-09-2023. This tour was organized as part of this educational strategy. The seven-day journey was supervised by two faculty members and one non-teaching staff member from the department. The faculty members who accompanied the students were Dr Younus Rashid, Tour in-charge and Mr. Ashiq Hussain and Mr Firdus Ahmad Mir, who provided logistical support. Known for its rich Buddhist heritage, Ladakh is home to numerous ancient relics, including statues, monasteries, and artwork that reflect its deep cultural roots. The primary objective of this tour was to familiarize students with the surviving antiquities of the area and to foster a deeper understanding of history through its architectural legacy. Additionally, visits to the museums in Leh and Kargil like Munshi Aziz Bhats Museum, provided valuable insights into how history is preserved and presented through artifacts left by previous generations.
